This incredible book gifting programme, introduced to Ireland by CDI in 2019, provides age-appropriate books to children from birth to five years old in Dublin 24. Partnering with An Post and other philanthropic organisations, we deliver handpicked stories that inspire and educate young minds, supporting their developmental journey and strengthening family connections.

Why Support This Programme?

Reading is a cornerstone of a child's educational journey, fostering cognitive development and parent-child bonding. Dolly Parton's Imagination Library ensures that every enrolled child, regardless of background, can build their own personal library of up to 60 books by the time they graduate from the programme.

Our Reach:

- Delivering around 5,000 books monthly to young readers in Dublin 24
- Over 300,000 books delivered in Tallaght to date
- More than 6,000 programme graduates as of May 2024
- Part of a global community that has distributed over 200 million books
